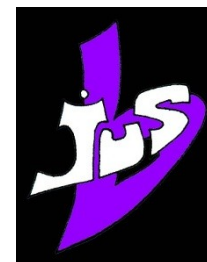

Here's the story of just one young person whose life has been changed through their time at JusB. *I've been coming to JusB since I was about 10. To start with I came to the club to socialise with friends but moved on to coming in regularly to use the recording studio, making tunes with Joel and Alex. I improved with motivation from both the workers, especially Joel*

who helped and mentored me. This year (2010) JusB has been a very positive place for me with the arrival of Damien, who has also mentored me.

In July I performed

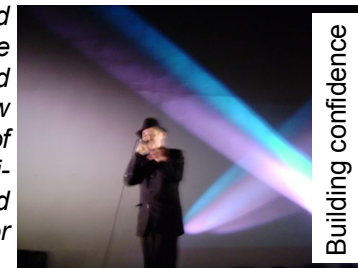
at the Arts Train event at the Bromley Civic Centre. This helped me a lot because it taught me how to be more comfortable in front of a camera and in front of an audience. I was tutored and prepared for the performance by Hector (Regal Players) who has

presented at the Smash Hits awards and the Mobo awards. I think him coming in was very positive as he taught me a lot about how to perform and grip an audience.

Recently I have auditioned for Britain's Got Talent and Damien went through what type of song the judges could relate to. After thinking hard about it, I decided to do a medley of 3 different types of songs and this worked very effectively. With ongoing support from youth workers, such as Michael and the world famous Jerry, I feel that JusB is like a second home for me and a safe place to keep me away from the streets.

That was last year. This year, there's more good news as the young man has continued to come and even done work experience with us.

JusB has helped me realise what I want I to do with my life and that is a career in youthwork.



Building confidence

What is JusB?

JusB is a community based youth charity in Bromley. We provide a safe place for young people to 'Just Be' and provide:

- ⇒ Youth centre work. Where young people can gain new skills, meet people and widen their horizons.
- ⇒ Advice, guidance and information. We love empowering young people help themselves by accessing employment, education or training.
- ⇒ Detached youth work. Getting into schools or walking the streets to meet young people where they're at.

Schools work

JusB is happy to visit local schools and help those who the school has identified as needing support. Our youth worker retells one young person's story.

'X' divulged that there was an argument between him and his mum. Things escalated and he threaten to burn (shoot) her. His mum told him to leave.

X left and stayed at his friend's house for two nights, returning the next night. When challenged as to why he threatened his mum, he could give no real explanation. He describes the relationship with his mum as on the rocks, saying

how unhappy he is with her.

X's home life is spilling over into his school life. A teacher said: *'X's presence within the class is increasingly becoming more intimidating. He struts around the room with a great physical presence. Today I actually felt violated by his use of language.(teacher recounts what X said)...He then put two fingers into my neck as if he had a gun.'*

Without intervention the question has to be asked where X,

and others like him, will end up. How will families, schools and the wider community be impacted? The fact that X is talking through his feelings at the start of our work with him is a sign that we may be able to help turn his life around. We only hope we can be there for others just like X into 2011.

A Safe Place

A couple of years ago I used to hang around in a big group, like other young people do. We used to hang about on the streets of Bromley with nothing to do and we got into a lot of trouble. Then Jerry, one of the youth workers, came up to us and told us about JusB. We then attended JusB to see whether it was good for us, and then started to come along every week. There are lots of things to do here, like recording music and using the ICT suite. It is also a safe place to hang around and there are lots of people to talk to.



I have now been coming to JusB for 2 years and it is a great environment, the people here are so friendly and are always here for you when you need to talk to someone. I now go to college and have found a work placement here at JusB and this is good because I'm learning things about young people that I didn't know before. The best thing about JusB is that everyone is friends.

JusB only has enough funding until summer! Please help us keep going.

The young lady wrote this last spring. Since then she has continued to visit JusB, even enjoying a tour that JusB and Stephen James organised to the car show rooms. Young people got a chance to talk to staff at the BMW dealership and see around the show room and garages, finding out more about the different career paths that staff had taken. Just before

Christmas our youth worker joined the young lady as she took her CV to local shops. We're pleased to say that the young lady has now got a job.
